CHURCH NEWS

We have just heard that Jane Baun, who until July ministered in this Parish, is to become full-time chaplain of Wadham College. She will be hopping between her teaching duties at Cuddesdon and Wadham for Michaelmas term, and then from Hilary term fully at Wadham starting with Hilary. Jane writes: 'This is a real leap out of my comfort zone into the front-line mission field of student welfare and the undergraduate mental health crisis, so I would be grateful for your prayers! Wadham has 450+ undergraduates, 200-something post-graduates, 120 staff, and 70ish fellows, so it's a bit like being the vicar of a small village. It has the distinction of being founded in 1610 by a non-royal laywoman, a wealthy West-country widow named Dorothy Wadham. She and her husband had been recusant Catholics, which is also pretty cool. Wadham has a great choir, a stunning Jacobean chapel, and evensong every Sunday at 6 in term-time, open to all, so do come!'

Desiring Life Autumn 2018: The Desiring Life Group meet fortnightly to discuss topics raised by particular books. All the meetings are held on Tuesday afternoons in the Parish Centre Lounge from 2.30pm and are led by members of

the clergy team or a member of the group. Starting on Tuesday 11 September we will be discussing:

Love is His Meaning – Understanding the teachings of Jesus by Keith Ward "The teachings of Jesus are of vital importance to Christians. No doubt there are many of Jesus' teachings that have not been recorded, just as there are many of his actions that were not recorded: 'There are also many other things that Jesus did; if everyone of them were written down, I suppose the world itself could not contain the books that were written' (John 21.25). The records we have in the Gospels are the first and only direct testimonies to the teachings of the person who is at the heart of the Christian faith".

No need to book a place, buy a copy of the book and turn up.
