

# Sunday 4 July 2021 Fifth Sunday after Trinity 11.15am Morning Prayer Revd Paul Smith

## Dear Friends

A warm welcome to St Nic's today for this service of Morning Prayer according to the Book of Common Prayer.

In the gospel set for today we see what lies at the very heart of the mission of the disciples which is the call for them to do as Jesus did. He gives them power to do the same mighty works that he has done – they don't make the decision to become an extension of his ministry, he does. This is a clear reminder that before the church is an institution made up of committed volunteers, it is a community with a difference and distinction because of the call and commission of Jesus. This is the only reason it is able to fulfil what we might call its mandate to preach and heal in the name of Jesus.

Having said this, the reality of rejection must be taken seriously. Jesus talks about shaking off the dust from the sandals of their feet. The disciples have to live with the prospect that not everything they teach and preach in the name of Christ will be either heard or accepted. They should be neither surprised or discouraged when doors are slammed in their faces. It is, after all, what Jesus himself experiences from all sorts of people, even his own family. I wonder where that gospel reality leaves us in our own secular society where the church in all its effort works hard to keep going. Surely it brings us to our knees; to a reliance on God which underlines that he has always be in charge of the community which is called and commissioned by Jesus; to the truth that we must persevere in the power of the Spirit.
